








Major Sports Trends Participation


- The graph to the right shows trends in participation for major sports through the years.

- Pickleball is seeing a rapid increase in participation in recent years.

- The graph to the right shows trends in participation for major indoor sports through the years.
- While Volleyball has declined in total participation, core participation is strong.
- Despite declining since its peak in the mid-90's, basketball remains one of the most popular sports in the nation.






Female Sports Trends Participation


- The graph to the right shows trends in participation for majority female sports through the years.

Majority-Female Sports Participation

























Surfaces vs. Facility Size

- A facility that aims to draw in regional and national events will want to maximize the numbers of courts.
- The diagram at right illustrates possible court orientations based on the scale of the facility.
- As shown, a 20,000 SF facility can fit 2 basketball courts while a 100,000 SF facility can fit 11 basketball courts.














2. Regional Sports Spend & Facilities

DuPage Area and Regional Sports Spend


- Each number in the dots to the right represent an index of spending within that region, where 110 represents 10% higher than the national average and 95 representing 5% less than the national average.



5. Preliminary Recommendations

Preliminary Recommendations

Before sharing some preliminary recommendations based on our research to date, it's important to share the definition of success and key objectives of this study provided by the Client group. Based on the input from the County, determining the market demand opportunity for a youth sports tourism-oriented complex(s) capable of hosting large regional/national events within DuPage County would cause increased economic impact within DuPage County with the increase in visitor spending.

Further context on the current state of DuPage County's Sports Tourism facilities is also important in framing the two scenarios presented below. Market demand opportunities for both indoor as well as outdoor are strong within DuPage County. In particular for a multipurpose indoor complex as well as a baseball/softball-oriented complex for outdoor programming. Thus, in an effort to align our recommendations with the definition of success as provided by the Client, it's our opinion that a multipurpose indoor sports complex would best meet that criteria. There are two main driving factors in that preferred Scenario A, the first factor is the scarcity of large plots of land available to execute a sizable sports tourism outdoor sports complex (at least, 80+ acres needed) and the second factor is the inclement weather and limitation on year-round usage that make an outdoor sports tourism venue less impactful than a year-round

indoor venue has the opportunity to provide.


Lastly, the Consulting Team was made aware during our study, that the City of Aurora has an RFQ out for an indoor sports complex that would likely be along a similar size and scale of a Multipurpose Indoor Sports Complex being recommended for DuPage County. However, we are of the opinion there is not enough indoor demand for two large-scale multipurpose indoor facilities to co-exist in the DuPage County area. Thus, the two scenarios outlined by Johnson Consulting are contingent on this Aurora facility being built or not.


- Scenario A is that the Aurora Complex does not get built, leaving DuPage County with an opportunity to build an indoor sports complex that would attract tourism to the county. An indoor facility would help bring youth sports tourism, especially during the winter months for sports such as basketball, volleyball, cheerleading, and dance tournaments. Local restaurants, retail, and hotels would be positively impacted by the flux in spending, but DuPage County would also have a significant community asset when sports tournaments are not being played there.
- Scenario B is that the Aurora Indoor Complex does get built, which would put a huge competitor in DuPage County's backdoor. DuPage can also support an
 outdoor facility, but it would have to be broken up between multiple sites. The limited developable available land in DuPage County necessitates multiple
 satellite sites for an outdoor facility. There would likely be a total of 15-20 multipurpose fields (soccer, football, lacrosse) and diamonds (baseball, softball) split
 up between 3-4 sites.


